



VARVARA, piano

Born in Moscow, she studied at the Gnessin Music School and the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory with Mikhail Voskressensky and later in Hamburg with Evgeni Koroliov. In 2006 she received a prize from the International Bach Competition in Leipzig and in 2012 she won the First Prize at the Géza Anda Competition in Zurich. Varvara has a great interest in art in all its expressions and has a wide repertoire that includes music from all periods.

She has performed with orchestras such as Vienna Radio Orchestra, Mariinsky Theatre Symphony Orchestra, Vienna Chamber Orchestra, Tonhalle Zürich, SWR Sinfonieorchester, Sinfónica de Galicia, Hungarian Radio Orchestra, Lille National Orchestra, Bilbao Symphony Orchestra, Tchaikovsky Symphony Orchestra, Santiago de Chile Philharmonic, Tokyo Symphony Orchestra, Polish National Radio Symphony Orchestra and Valencia Symphony Orchestra. She has worked with conductors such as Eliahu Inbal, Valery Gergiev, David Zinman, Cornelius Meister, Tamás Vásáry, Clemens Schuldt, Alexander Liebreich and Vladimir Fedoseyev. Varvara develops an important activity as recitalist in Festivals and concert halls such as Lucerne Festival, Tonhalle Zürich, La Grange de Meslay, Auditorio Madrid, Conservatory Moscow, Philharmonie Paris, Palau de la Música Barcelona, Le Corum Montpellier, Conservatorio Verdi Milano, Auditorio Lingotto Torino, Auditorium Lyon, Mariinsky Theatre, Rudolfinum Prague, Mozarteum Salzburg or the Konzerthaus Dortmund.

During the current season 22/23, Varvara has performances with the Vienna Chamber Orchestra, Orquesta de Valencia, Sinfónica de Galicia, Lille Orchestra and Osaka Philharmonic Orchestra, chamber music concerts at Concertgebouw with Jonathan Roozeman, with the Pavel Haas Quartet, Fumiaki Miura, and Cosmos Quartett, among others. She will perform as soloist at Théâtre de la Ville (Paris), Pianisten am Mainz (Stuttgart), Festival La Folle Journée (Nantes), Palau de la Musica (Barcelona) and Ibercamera Girona, where she is Artist-in-Residence this season.

Varvara is also passionate about chamber music and forms a permanent duo with violinist Fumiaki Miura and another with cellist Jonathan Roozeman, with whom she also forms a trio. She also collaborates with the Schumann Quartet, the Borodin Quartet, the Cosmos Quartet, and the Ludwig Trio.

Alongside her acclaimed recordings of Mozart and Handel (Dis:camera), she has recently recorded a live album at the Philharmonie de Paris dedicated to Liszt (Dis:Camera) and a recording of the Goldberg Variations, soon to be released.
